NSW could be the next domino to fall as fundamental human rights are trampled by so-called conversion practices laws around the country.

Victoria's recent *Change or Suppression (Conversion) Practices Prohibition Act* is one of the most radical and overreaching laws **in the world.**¹ It promotes LGBTQ+ lifestyle while criminalising alternative approaches to human sexuality.

Alex Greenwich has introduced his Conversion Practices Prohibition Bill, which largely mirrors the Victorian legislation.² The Minns government is also considering similar legislation in NSW, and a Consultation Paper has been circulated.³

Conversion therapy laws don't only target religious people, they are bad for all Australians. Here's why:



They tear families apart – Under such laws parents, teachers, and counsellors can be criminally prosecuted for acting in a child's best interest when addressing sexual attraction.



They harm members of the LGBT community – Such laws directly hinder adults who, desiring to live out their moral beliefs and values, seek and consent to counselling and medical care for managing unwanted same-sex attraction. Their fundamental right to choose the support they want is denied.⁴

They trample religious freedom – Religious practices, like prayer and pastoral counselling, could be explicitly banned if they clash with progressive LGBTIQ+ ideologies.⁵



They jeopardise religious communities – Churches, mosques and synagogues could lose their ability to ensure that their members, employees, volunteers and leaders conform to their beliefs. If a synagogue can't ensure its Rabbi lives according to Jewish doctrine, it can't protect its religious character.⁶



They violate fundamental human rights – Victorian legislation grants excessive powers to government bureaucracy to investigate, re-educate, punish and suppress people for exercising their fundamental human rights.⁷

Example Scenario[®]

Darwish is a member of the Coptic Christian church and **struggles with feelings with same sex attraction.** As a person of faith, his faith anchors him and gives a sense of purpose and belonging.

Darwish sought counselling, prayer and advice from the leaders at his Church, who referred him to a psychiatrist connected to his faith community he sought to help Darwish understand and work through his feelings of same-sex attraction.

According to the Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission, **both Darwish's church leaders and the psychiatrist could be criminally charged for trying to help Darwish manage his unwanted feelings of same-sex attraction.**
